This is an essay in three parts. Most readers today are already familiar with the story of the emergence of DeepSeek so I won't spend much time reiterating the event. This isn't so much the story of DeepSeek as it is the revelation of the underlying circumstances of American AI development, details which the Western media have conveniently ignored and which no other writers seem to have noticed. This is also an essay documenting that our world is seldom as we imagine it to be. See Parts 2 and 3.

The Emergence of DeepSeek

An unknown Chinese company “ignited panic” in Silicon Valley (and the White House) after releasing a new AI model named DeepSeek that outperforms America’s best. In a recent article, Mike Whitney wrote that “DeepSeek is a nuclear bomb detonated in the heart of Silicon Valley.” He went on to say that it was a challenge (and is really a slap in the face) to the tech experts in the US who thought they were gods and that “their reign would last forever”. Why the “panic” and the “nuclear bomb” analogy?

Why the “panic” and the “nuclear bomb” analogy? Well, mostly because American AI firms spent a decade or so, and hundreds of billions of dollars to develop their models using hundreds of thousands of the latest and most powerful Graphic Processing chips (**GPUs**) (**at \$40,000 each**), while **DeepSeek was built in only two months, for less than \$6 million and with much less-powerful GPUs than the US firms used. DeepSeek uses 97% less power and cost 50 times less to run. And maybe the worst part was that they did it entirely with Chinese talent – no Americans necessary.**

Further, **DeepSeek scored as high or higher than OpenAI’s o1** on a variety of third-party benchmarks. **DeepSeek’s model outperformed Meta’s Llama 3.1, OpenAI’s ChatGPT-4o and Anthropic’s Claude Sonnet 3.5** in accuracy ranging from complex problem-solving to math and coding. To add insult to injury, **DeepSeek quickly also released its Version r1**, a

reasoning model that **also outperformed OpenAI's latest and best o1 in nearly all tests.** [2]

Not only that, **the American AI firms**, with the exception of Facebook (Meta) considered their models **"proprietary"** and thus closed-source, **meaning that users had to pay high or very high fees to use them.** OpenAI's o1, which is available only to paying ChatGPT subscribers of the Plus tier **(\$20 per month)** and more expensive tiers **(such as Pro at \$200 per month)**, while enterprise users who want access to the full model must pay fees that can easily run to hundreds of thousands of dollars per year.

But **DeepSeek (all versions) was released as fully open source, which means anyone can download and use free of charge, and can also adapt and amend it for their own purposes.** [3] This explains why DeepSeek quickly rocketed to the top of apps downloaded on both the Apple Store and on Google, which is a tremendous feat for a company that no one had even heard of a few days before.

DeepSeek can produce AI models that are an order of magnitude more efficient than the current state of the art from OpenAI, Google, Anthropic, and others. "Even by the most cynical projections, it still cost them only a fraction of what others have spent. And it's free." Instead of paying OpenAI or Google \$20 per month or \$200, for their advanced models, **you can use DeepSeek and get exactly the same level of results free."** [4]

DeepSeek's Innovative Advantages



It is the difference between being taught a narrow range of things, and learning independently without restrictions.

DeepSeek surpasses OpenAI's top model in math and software engineering. It doesn't use the traditional "supervised learning" that the American models use, in which the model is given data and told how to solve problems. Instead, it uses what is called "**reinforcement learning**", which is a brilliant approach that makes the model stumble around until it finds the correct solution and **then "learns" from that process.** **It is the difference between being taught a narrow range of things, and learning independently without restrictions.** This alone prompts experts to speculate that AI could evolve beyond human oversight.

A great advantage of DeepSeek is that it is open-source, permitting everyone to use and adapt it to their own needs. Also, **DeepSeek reveals its thinking which the American AI models refused to do, from a fear that others could use that information to build their own model.** Now, nothing is classified; it is all in the open. [5] One of the most remarkable things about **DeepSeek** is that it **can do what is called "chain of thought", and it "explains" its reasoning, step by step in its responses.** The program actually appears to "think through" the problems, and displays its reasoning processes which are remarkably human in appearance. [6] **ChatGPT does this too,** but nowhere as well. Also, **DeepSeek can even be run on an ordinary computer.** [7]

DeepSeek trained its LLM with a mind-boggling 670 billion parameters, but they didn't "copy" that from OpenAI or anyone else. Partly, they used a very innovative programming approach called "**Mixture of Experts**", programming various portions of the large model for specific tasks so that **the entire huge model needn't be accessed for every question on every topic.** [8]

To assist the "Mixture of Experts", they created advanced algorithms that would break down tasks into small manageable bits, **so that many things could be processed simultaneously.** This kind of optimization requires serious technical expertise, because it isn't just understanding the software, **but also the intricacies of the hardware itself**, making the process much faster and infinitely more efficient. And this is what sets DeepSeek apart from the others. **DeepSeek looked for elegance and efficiency** while the Americans were focused only on raw power.

But more than this, they actually re-programmed the GPUs to accommodate this process. This is speaking directly to the hardware itself. It is extremely efficient, but requires hugely more expertise to do it. Their abstract specifically mentions that **the engineers at DeepSeek reconfigured the GPUs**, dedicating parts of them to specific tasks. **This is far beyond the abilities of most people**, and no indication that the "experts" at OpenAI or Meta had the ability to do this. **They actually re-designed how the data traffic flows within the GPU itself**, which increased the efficiency by orders of magnitude.

Everybody was Surprised

The open-source availability of DeepSeek-R1, its high performance, and the fact that it seemingly “came out of nowhere” to challenge the former leader of generative AI, sent shockwaves throughout Silicon Valley and far beyond. Observers were unanimous in stating that this development was a total surprise, that **no one in Silicon Valley or in the US government had any idea that China was doing anything significant in AI and uniformly believed the Chinese were “years behind” the US in development.** They were suddenly faced with an accomplished fact; that **Chinese researchers had produced an AI model that exceeded or matched the performance of the best that the US had produced, and was “cheaper, more accessible and more transparent.”**

The first huge surprise was the cost. An unknown Chinese lab produced a better product with an expense of little more than \$5 million, while US firms had collectively spent literally hundreds of billions of dollars. People close to OpenAI’s management claim the company spent a staggering \$540 million in 2022 training ChatGPT. Even worse (if things could be worse), **the research firm SemiAnalysis said OpenAI is paying as much as \$700,000 per day to keep ChatGPT servers up and running,** just from the amount of computing resources it requires. Google’s 2024 expenditures alone were **\$51 billion.** **Microsoft** put more than **\$13 billion** into OpenAI, which investment may now be lost. The actual running cost is also extremely low. One Chinese AI CEO said, “If you want to build a new model, you can pay Open AI \$4.40 per million tokens, or **you can pay the Chinese firm only \$0.10.”** [10] AI users had three huge problems with **OpenAI-o1**: It was (a) **too slow**, (b) **too expensive**, and (c) **lacked control for end user/reliance on OpenAI.** **DeepSeek R1 solved all of these.** [11]

Some Bad News – DeepSeek was a “side project”

One aspect of this development that almost no one seemed to notice was that DeepSeek was not an AI firm. The model was developed by the parent company High-Flyer, which is a quant company (a quantitative trading firm), a small hedge fund that uses mathematical and statistical models to develop stock trading strategies. In 2021 everyone laughed at DeepSeek’s founder, **Liang WenFeng, spending millions on AI chips, calling it a “rich man’s hobby”, [12][13]** assuming Liang was engaged in a pathetic attempt to enter the AI field. But he was instead using the AI chips to build a model for investment trading. Somewhere in that process, they realized they could use what they already had created to also produce a high-level AI model, so they did that. The truth is that **DeepSeek was just a little side project by a small Chinese investment hedge fund. [14][15][16]**

More Bad News – Stock Prices

The news from China about DeepSeek sent US tech stocks plummeting. **Nvidia's stock had the biggest single-day loss of any company in history, shedding around \$600 million in value, and the entire US stock market lost more than \$1 trillion – all this in only one day.** Many AI and tech stocks were down by 10%, 15% and more, in all Western countries. The US dollar also dropped by 0.5% on the news. **All because of the release of a Chinese chatbot.** That's not bad for a small Chinese company that no one had ever heard of.

"And all of this was from fear that a small Chinese company had developed a new AI model in only two months at a small fraction of the cost of the American versions which were infinitely more expensive and required a decade or more to create. This development has "thrown a wrench" into the entire works of the American Investment community." [17][18] The assumption had always been that the US had an insurmountable lead in AI, which was going to be the "next industrial revolution", and this potentially changes everything. **The Americans obviously have no lead or advantage in AI, which has huge implications for not only investment markets but in geopolitical terms as well.**

The large American AI firms led everyone to believe that AI required massive computing resources and expensive hardware, but DeepSeek proved this was not true. One result of this breakthrough was the realisation that tech stocks, not only the AI firms, but companies like Nvidia, were grossly overpriced, **perhaps beginning a long-term slide in the stock values of all these companies.** [19]

Gary Marcus, US university professor and AI expert: "I think OpenAI is highly overvalued. I think we saw their business model blow up, **with DeepSeek giving away for free what they wanted to charge for.** Also, DeepSeek is much more open than OpenAI. I think a \$157 billion valuation is difficult to justify when you're losing \$5 billion a year. And **their product, the large language models, aren't that reliable; we know that it hallucinates, makes stuff up, makes weird errors.** We may see their valuation plummet. [20]

Still More Bad News – DeepSeek is Free



After all, if the free Chinese model can do the same job as well or better, why would you pay the American firms their very high prices for the same thing?

"If you want to build powerful AI models, you need powerful AI chips, and those are made only by Nvidia at the moment. The US government prohibits Nvidia from selling those chips to Chinese firms, so the Chinese compensated by creating an infrastructure that made the training of these models extremely efficient. **Thus, they needed less than 1/100th of the power to accomplish the same thing.**" Moreover, the announcement of the Chinese model as "open source", **in other words, free**, severely threatening the long-term value of the very expensive American models – which may depreciate to nearly zero. After all, **if the free Chinese model can do the same job as well or better, why would you pay the American firms their very high prices for the same thing?** [21]

And Yet More Bad News – Other Chinese firms are doing this too

To make matters worse, another Chinese company, **TikTok's parent ByteDance**, released a new AI reasoning model that also outperforms OpenAI's o1 in key benchmark test. At the end of January, 2025, **Alibaba** released its new AI model Qwen 2.5, which is also sending shockwaves through Silicon Valley because it seems to be a much superior model to OpenAI's best, and is apparently outperforming Meta's Llama and all the other models on benchmark tests. Like DeepSeek, it is also very inexpensive to run. [22] Another Chinese startup named **Moonshot** has released its new Kimi, which is claims is on a par with AI's best. [23]



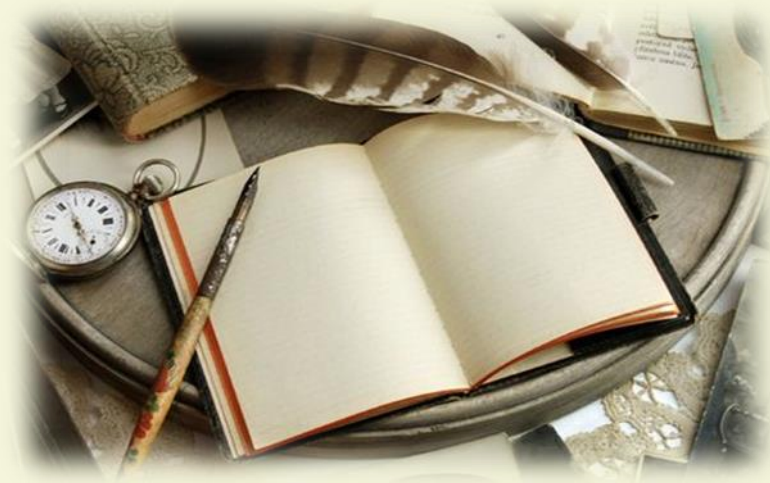

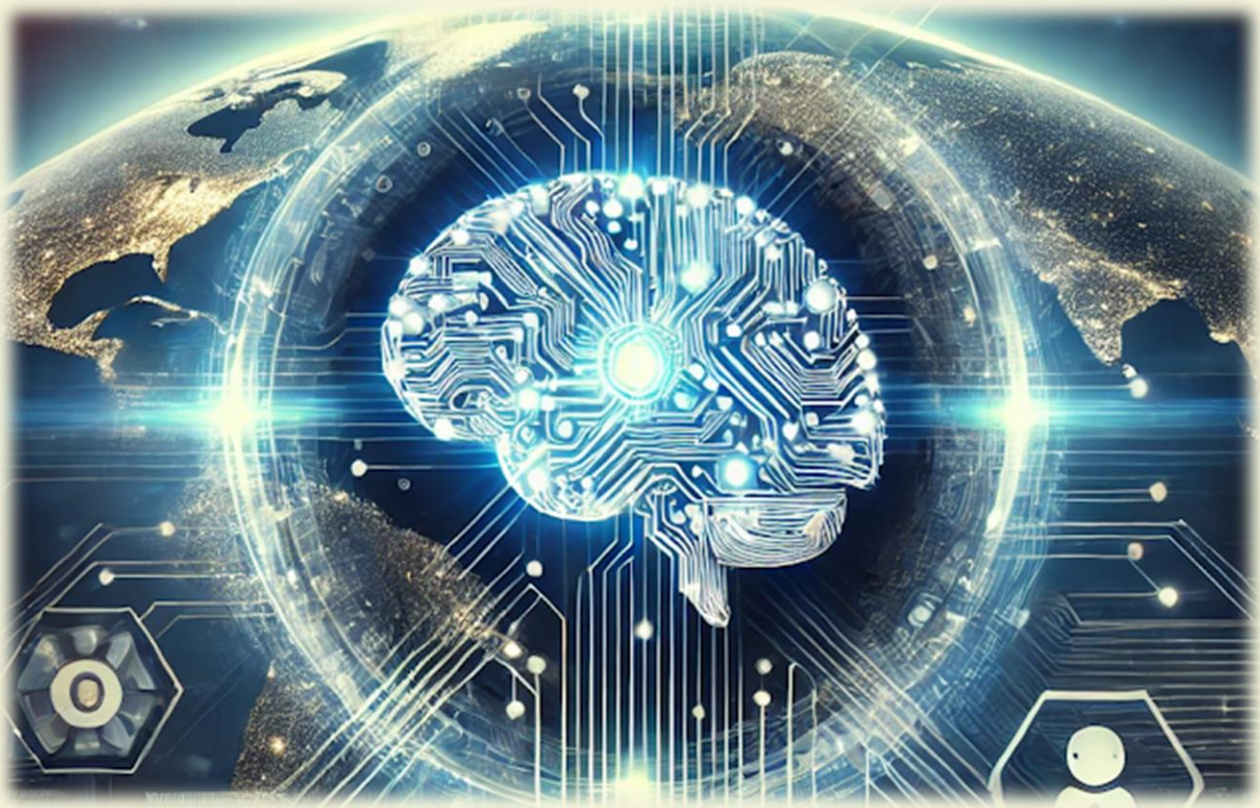

Sam Altman, the CEO of OpenAI, said, "This will be the greatest technology humanity has yet developed". **Microsoft CEO Satya Nadella** said the new DeepSeek model was both "super-impressive" and "super-efficient", and the AI developments coming out of China needed to be taken "very, very seriously". **[1]French entrepreneur Arnaud Bertrand** said, "There's no overstating how profoundly this changes the whole game. Alexander Wang, CEO of ScaleAI said, "What we found was that DeepSeek, the leading Chinese AI lab, their models are actually the top performing or roughly on par with the best American models." **[4]Aravind Srinivas, CEO of Perplexity AI**, said it's a myth that Chinese are good only at copying, so that if we stop writing research papers in America, if we stop describing the details of our infrastructure architecture, and don't open-source, China will never be able to catch up. But the truth is that ... **DeepSeek is so good that the American firms will copy it all.****[5]** More than 670 derivative models have already been created from DeepSeek, all around the world, and that is the power of open-source models. **[6]**

Facebook (Meta) is integrating as much of DeepSeek as it can, into its own model. **Mark Zuckerberg said, "Engineers are moving frantically to dissect DeepSeek and copy anything and everything we can from it. I'm not even exaggerating."** **Amazon** is offering it and also using and integrating it. **Microsoft** is hosting it on Azure, and even **Nvidia** is hosting DeepSeek R1 on its developer platform. One AI company said they had heard from many **Fortune 500 companies** who want to run DeepSeek and who are questioning whether they want to continue to pay OpenAI such high monthly fees when they could run DeepSeek themselves for free. **[7]**

Then Everybody Bashed it . . .

Can’t let the Commies Have it



And that’s more dangerous because then they get to own the mindshare, the entire American AI ecosystem.

Sam Altman from OpenAI now claims “We worry a lot about authoritarian governments developing this... [having AI] in the wrong human hands” [\[9\]](#) **Aravind Srinivas, the CEO of Perplexity AI,** said “the most dangerous thing is that the Chinese have the best open-source model and all the Americans are now building on that. And **that’s more dangerous because then they get to own the mindshare, the entire American AI ecosystem.**” [\[10\]](#)

National Security

The White House is looking into “national security” concerns with DeepSeek and, as the initial excitement subsided, US officials discovered “national security implications”, [11] which were so serious that the **US Navy** immediately banned the use of DeepSeek by any and all naval staff. [12] **Italy** said “the data of millions of Italians could be at risk”. **Australia** has told its citizens to “be very careful” when using the app; in other words, “Don’t use it.” Asked about national security concerns, **Matt Sheehan, a fellow at the Carnegie Institute for Perpetual War**, said “Yes, almost certainly”; whether their data is going to China, and could be accessed by the Chinese Communist Party. [13]

Graphic Processing Units (GPUs)

Alexander Wang said, “The Chinese labs have more H100s (the most powerful GPUs) than people think. My understanding is that DeepSeek has about 50,000 H100s, which they can’t talk about, obviously, because it’s against the export controls the US has put in place.” [14] **JP Morgan, Citibank** and others have accused the Chinese firm of having as many as 50,000 GPUs instead of the 2,000 they claimed. [15] **Elon Musk** accused DeepSeek of lying about its breakthrough model. He says the Chinese company is lying about how many chips it has purchased. [16] **Joseph Carlson**, a self-styled AI investment expert, said, “I don’t believe you, DeepSeek. I think you spent a lot more money. There are rumors out there that they had 50,000 GPUs, which sounds a lot more reasonable.” [17]

Psy-op; send a message



“It’s symbolic that DeepSeek released their first model on Christmas Day when the rest of us are celebrating...”

A few people were quick to say that DeepSeek was just “A CCP psy-op”, conducting economic warfare against the US, and making American AI unprofitable. **[18]** Alexander Wang from ScaleAI said, **“It’s symbolic that DeepSeek released their first model on Christmas Day when the rest of us are celebrating...”** **[19]** “China” released DeepSeek R1 on the very same day Trump was inaugurated, to “send a stern message” to the US government. **[20]**

Cheap China, low quality

“Investors are thinking there is more hype than substance in DeepSeek. DeepSeek has shown only that you can train a small model off a larger one. Deepseek hasn’t shown they are capable of training the next iteration.” **[21]** What does this mean? It is like saying that you can build a beautiful and perfect 2-story house, but that is irrelevant and useless because you haven’t proven you can build a 3-story house. American reasoning at its finest. Singapore Live TV said that DeepSeek may be “a viable solution for the lower end of the market but not for the higher end”. **[22]** This is called “damning with faint praise”.

Summary? China Copies, Steals, and Lies About Everything

Kevin O’Leary, Chairman O’Leary Ventures: “There’s a lot of skepticism about this DeepSeek product. A \$6 million dollar price from the desk of a hedge fund manager; I don’t believe it. No one does. We are in a propaganda war, an economic war, a technological war with China. Very risky to put this stuff on your phones. What they did was to copy technology that was already existing. It was innovated in the United States. **[23] Matt Sheehan, Carnegie Institute for Perpetual War,** “We always need to take information with a grain of salt when it’s coming from China”. **[24]**

Commentary

“China” released DeepSeek; “Beijing’s latest thrust”; “The Chinese Communist Party’s offensive”. What rubbish. It wasn’t “China” who created DeepSeek, and had nothing to do with either Beijing or the Chinese Communist Party. How dare the inscrutable Chinese release something during Christmas, when the Americans aren’t watching? American conspiracy theorists may be deeply disappointed to learn that nobody at DeepSeek gives a shit what is happening in Washington on any particular day.

All of this contrary noise was just the daily China-bashing that occurs in the Western media: “If anyone from China said it, it cannot be true”. **Of course, there is never any evidence presented; every dirty accusation against China is treated as fact – no evidence required.** Data privacy and national security noise are nonsense, since DeepSeek can be downloaded and run on computers in the US, with no connection or contact with China.

China made awesome mobile phones and the US banned them. China made fantastic and inexpensive EV cars and the US banned them. China makes the best small drones in the world, so the US banned them. China made one of the most popular social media platforms in the world, and the US banned it. Now a Chinese company produced an amazing and inexpensive AI model, and already the US is looking for excuses to ban it.

If the US makes a breakthrough it’s a giant step for mankind, but if a Chinese firm makes a breakthrough, it’s a threat to the world’s national security. A small Chinese firm creates one AI model, and suddenly China wants to dominate the world. **So much irrationality and hysterical nonsense. If the US were a person, it would be a 14-year-old girl.**

On the Other Hand . . .

Gary Marcus, US university professor and AI expert, was asked if we can trust what DeepSeek has said. His response was that it's very likely that what DeepSeek described, is correct. He said he read their papers, and it all makes sense, and their results have already been replicated by others. What they did is plausible; they worked harder on optimization than other people. DeepSeek did it in super-impressive fashion, and it is likely legitimate. **[25]**

It doesn't matter if it's a Chinese government psy-op or not. The technological innovation is real, and having a model train itself through reinforcement learning is impressive. DeepSeek's technical paper says clearly that the \$6 million does not include costs associated with prior research on architectural algorithms. **[26]DeepSeek's research papers were so detailed in describing how they did what they did, and many companies have already reproduced their results, so there is no room for doubt that their claims were factual.**

China Stole All OpenAI's Data. Oh, no, wait . . .



OpenAI went to the *Financial Times* with a complaint that DeepSeek may have used OpenAI's data to train its model. They claimed they had seen "some evidence" of distillation which they "suspect" "may have come from" DeepSeek, but of course they declined to provide details of their evidence. But **where did OpenAI obtain all the data to train its own model? It stole it from websites all over the world.** Every website is copyrighted, and every country has copyright laws stating it is illegal to take all of the content from a website, then repackage and sell it commercially. Yet this is precisely what OpenAI did.

The truth is that OpenAI built their entire business on data they stole from everyone else. Sam Altman, the CEO of OpenAI, has admitted this many times, and Satya Nadella, the CEO of Microsoft, said that anything that can be accessed on the internet is in the public domain and can simply be taken by anyone who wants it. But it's a felony crime if you do it to them. **This is exactly the same as calling the police to report that someone stole a car from you, that you stole from someone else yesterday.**

"OpenAI pulled a fast one. They began accusing DeepSeek of copying their text. They say the Chinese company used OpenAI's data to train their model, and OpenAI says they have the evidence although they refuse to release it – which means they don't have it. "It is hard to miss the irony here. **OpenAI is having a meltdown because someone may have done what**

they have been doing for years. [OpenAI] is a company that has been training on copyrighted material with no shame; books, news articles, music, Youtube videos. OpenAI has literally been ripping off other people's work, so what's the fuss about now? And this is not even a secret. OpenAI's leadership has talked about it. Sam Altman himself has acknowledged it, so **why are they playing the victim now? They should know that the copy-paste button works both ways.**" [27]

DeepSeek "stole" OpenAI's Data? What makes you think it was OpenAI's data in the first place? **Why are we so obsessed with the possibility of Chinese companies stealing our data when American companies actually ARE stealing our data?** Every website has a 'sign' that says you cannot take their content and use it for your commercial purposes without permission and payment. But it seems OpenAI didn't see that sign, and stole all the data from millions of websites, without permission and without paying. Well, OpenAI, it seems that maybe DeepSeek missed seeing that sign on your website, too. [28]

But apparently not everyone sees the irony in this. **David Sacks, White House AI and Crypto Czar:** "There is substantial evidence that what DeepSeek did here is they distilled the knowledge out of OpenAI's models, and I don't think OpenAI is very happy about this. [29] [We need to] slow down some of these copycat models." [30]

Yet while OpenAI is crying "foul", they are already embroiled in copyright lawsuits in many countries. A huge "landmark" lawsuit was filed in India by the Indian News Agency ANI back in 2024, who accused OpenAI of improperly using copyrighted content. [31] "They have scraped and used copyrighted material from all the news websites without permission." Several other major news websites in India have already joined the lawsuit. OpenAI is embroiled in other lawsuits as well. They are being sued by the New York Times, other NY newspapers, various authors and journalists, and all indications are that this may snowball into something huge. [32][33][34] Microsoft is being sued as well.

OpenAI's troubles are just beginning. They issued a press release saying they might have to totally withdraw ChatGPT from Europe, because of their privacy and copyright infringements. This is so serious for OpenAI that "persons" in the UK are floating new legislation to make this particular kind of copyright violation "legal". If you or I copy something from a website without permission, we might be bankrupted or even go to prison, but if the large tech companies steal data from millions of websites, that somehow becomes praiseworthy and deserving of immunity. [35]

In fact, OpenAI is being sued by many groups in countries all around the world, now embroiled in multiple legal battles for everything from privacy issues, to copyright violations, to character defamation, and is even being investigated by US FTC and SEC. [36] OpenAI is being sued in Germany for unlicensed use of song lyrics. [37] The list goes on.

Then the CIA Cyber-Attacks . . .



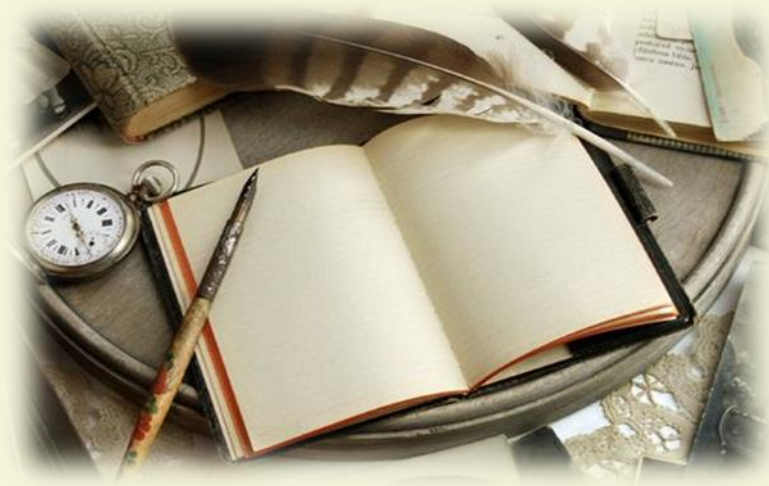
The US government, perhaps abetted by its friends in OpenAI, immediately launched massive and protracted DDOS and other cyber-attacks on DeepSeek...

On January 28, 2025, DeepSeek announced it was limiting registrations and restricting access because its website was being subjected to massive, "large-scale and malicious" cyber-attacks from the US. [38] The reason was that American users flocked to DeepSeek's website to download the app, making it **the #1 download on both Apple's app store and on Google.** **As soon as this happened, the US government, perhaps abetted by its friends in OpenAI, immediately launched massive and protracted DDOS and other cyber-attacks on DeepSeek.**

Another article said, "DeepSeek is restricting registrations and limiting who can log into its website, allowing only China-based phone numbers, because of large-scale and malicious cyber-attacks. These attacks on DeepSeek add to the intrigue." [39] It was interesting to see that DeepSeek must have been expecting this response, and had the technical skill to combat it. Their website was never forced off-line; they simply found it necessary to reduce new registrations. Well-done, China.

"With great fame comes great risk. The company was hit by a cyber-attack that was so bad they had to limit registrations. **The timing was suspicious and the world wasted no time in determining who was the culprit.**" [40] Sky News in Australia said that DeepSeek was so popular that downloads of the app were causing their website to crash, completely ignoring the statements on their own website of the malicious cyber-attacks. [41]

One aspect that has been ignored by everyone is the almost total Jewish control in the West of all information and information processing, and that includes the world of AI. Open AI, with Sam Altman at its head, is a Jewish company. Facebook (now “Meta”) and Google are the same. Some AI companies may have Indian CEOs, but the money behind them is Jewish. Nvidia is a Jewish company. Jensen Huang is not Jewish but his partners are; Huang is the public face of Nvidia, the typical “Gentile Front”. Microsoft’s Bill Gates is not a Jew, but Steve Ballmer is, and why do you imagine Ballmer was parachuted into Microsoft so early in its career and remained the #2 man through its history?

AI, Google and Search Engines



If I were to ask, you would tell me that Google is a search engine, but you would be wrong. **Google is not a search engine, and has not been so for a long time. Google is a gate-keeper with only two functions. One is to feed you only the information its Jewish owners want you to have, and the other is to ensure that you never find information they don't want you to have.** This is so true that even if you know the precise title of a document, Google will simply refuse to produce it. **Bing and others are the same. DuckDuckGo is a Jewish search engine located in Israel and, while it may appear to "find more things" than Google, it also records all your searches and forwards them to the "appropriate authorities".** They claim, "Our free, go-to browser comes with over a dozen powerful privacy protections built-in, including our search engine that replaces Google and doesn't track your search history." **The claims are a lie. There is no longer any searching that can be done on the Internet in the Western countries that is not heavily censored and monitored – all in terms of Jewish interests. Russia's Yandex and China's Baidu are probably the only safe ones, but they don't cover the Western world as much as we would like. Baidu particularly is focused mostly on China.**

This is very important because the Jewish kingpins of AI are now heavily promoting the ability of models like ChatGPT **"to do all your searching for you"**. It was already very bad, **with society much separated from the real Internet by the gate-keepers, and now there will be a second level of separation and isolation from the actual Internet, and browsers as we know them might disappear to be replaced by the Jewish AI bots.** For the great majority, there is no solution to this surreptitious and insidious control of information. **And this control is rapidly becoming total; make no mistake about that, and it is entirely controlled by Jews to fulfill their agenda. If you watch the interviews with Sam Altman of OpenAI, his working definition of a safe chatbot is one that won't be critical of anything involving the Jews or Israel.**

We still have the ability to go to news sites like CNN or the BBC and search their archives without external interference, **but there are literally millions of other websites out there that contain critical content, that we will never know about and will never be able to find. This is not an accident; it is part of the plan.**

There is evidence for this, verifiable reports that since about March of 2024, after their data was plundered by AI, hundreds of thousands of small and medium-sized websites have just “disappeared” from Google’s search results. Google has actually destroyed hundreds of thousands of good websites by refusing to produce them in searches, **instead sending people to those websites where Google has connections and can sell ads. [1]** Many of those websites spent huge amounts of money to create their content, but once OpenAI stole all their data, Google now apparently delists them and no one can find them. One result, of course, is that **plagiarism and copyright violations are now almost impossible to prove.**

The Jewish-controlled models of AI present a serious danger to all Western societies. **ChatGPT and similar models appear innocent at first, a new toy, but they are not a toy.** The plan is to insinuate them into our lives by making things convenient, and to then control what we see, what we think and, eventually, how we behave. They are not only information tools but monitors and controllers. **Larry Ellison told the world very clearly that everyone "would be on their best behavior" once AI is fully insinuated into Western society. [2] [3] This is not different than were the proposed "COVID-19 Passports", which were meant to be used to control much of Western society.** If you publicly contradicted the official narrative, becoming a "conspiracy theorist" or if you (God forbid) became a "**vaccination terrorist**", **your bank accounts and credit cards would be blocked. You would lose all access to cash, until you either died of hunger or resigned yourself to your new fate. AI is serving the same mission, for the same masters.**

As I evidenced in Part 2 of this series, the Jews stole all of the data they used to create their AI tools and models, violating the IP and copyrights of millions of websites and authors. OpenAI is being sued all over the world for this, as is Microsoft and others, but they have no intention of stopping. **The crimes that Sam Altman and other Jews committed in this context are staggering; they literally stole copyrighted content from millions or hundreds of millions of websites and authors. Microsoft's CEO** accurately reflected the Jews' contempt for the rule of law when he blithely **declared the entire Internet to be "public domain"**.

The evidence of the Jews' criminality is everywhere. It isn't only the theft of data, but the insidious uses to which they applied it. **As one example, Google provided the Jews in Israel with AI tools to perpetuate the ongoing Genocide of Palestinian women and children, targeting and killing all "dissidents" and their families. [4]** The Jews were literally "livestreaming genocide". They will never be held accountable. **Julian Assange stated that "Artificial intelligence is being used for mass assassinations in Gaza. The majority of targets in Gaza are bombed as a result of artificial intelligence targeting."**

Yet Altman hallucinates about developing AI models that contain “democratic values”, and laments the thought of “authoritarian governments” possessing these tools. But the US and Israel are by far the most authoritarian countries in the world, where most elements of the “rule of law” have been tossed out the window. There is no longer any question of the intent that AI will lead us to police states in the West. In most European countries, police, immigration and security authorities are rapidly developing and using AI in increasingly disturbing contexts. **Huge amounts of EU funds are being invested in AI-based population surveillance infrastructure.** [5] The prospects are frightening, and none of this will have a good end.

The real truth is that AI has not been developed as a useful tool, in the sense of a personal computer or a mobile phone, but was designed with the intent of population control, and your belief in this is not required for its success. The evidence is everywhere, if only you care to look, but I fear that no one will look until it is too late.

OpenAI is an Amoeba and Sam Altman is a Virus



One of the arrows in the quiver of the attack on humanity from the Jewish push to globalisation is a new field of study – the biology of corporations. Jewish Corporate apologists claim that the overwhelming majority of multi-national companies are amoral organizations in pursuit of pure profit, and will abide by ethical or legal codes only to the extent that this behavior will maximise their profit. [6]

They take the view that multi-national companies can be described as – and function as – an amoeba or a virus, as non-sentient beings simply living their lives and multiplying as their Creator intended, following the law of their nature. Just as whales feed on plankton, Jews don't steal from the poor and prey on the vulnerable because they are evil; **they do it because they are "feeding"**. We are told that when a doctor studies the behavior of a virus, he doesn't morally justify its killing humans, but he excuses its homicidal behavior because a virus simply acts according to its nature, human judgments of ethics or morality being misplaced.

The Jews lecture us that morality therefore isn't a part of business, **that any company will deceive, lie, cheat and price-gouge to the maximum extent possible**, but that corporations shouldn't be punished any more than should viruses. **They claim it is the nature of a corporation to be a predator, to cheat, misrepresent and steal, so as to increase profits, that this is the natural order of things, and therefore no corporation has responsibility toward its victims.**

Corollaries of this rich philosophical insight are that right and wrong are meaningless concepts in a corporation, that there is no such thing as corporate social (or any other) responsibility. **According to the Jews, it is just a law of nature that the strong prey on the weak,** that there are no applicable morals or ethical standards in this natural order of the world, and that we cannot punish nature for taking its normal course. Corporations (and presumably their Jewish owners) are simply unthinking, non-sentient brainless amoeba who react with instinct. **They are not capable of acting, nor have they any responsibility to act, with high-mindedness or compassion or a sense of fair play and honesty.**

Censorship and Other Lies



Diedre Bosa said that at least to some degree DeepSeek's output is filtered or influenced by the Chinese government. [7] That may be true, **but irrelevant because anything "filtered" by the Chinese government relates to internal Chinese matters which are of little or no consequence to anyone outside China.** Some people asking if or why DeepSeek won't discuss certain Chinese historical events. There are many responses to this question, one of which is that maybe "certain Chinese historical events" are none of your damned business.

It cannot be a surprise to anyone that it is primarily, and almost exclusively, the Americans and the Jews who heavily censor everything. The Jews tried to cast aspersions on DeepSeek because it had no comments to make on Tiananmen Square, **but if you want to see an AI model that is heavily censored, ask ChatGPT or any other OpenAI model about the genocide in Palestine or Jewish ownership of the US FED, about the Rothschilds and Sassoons growing opium in India and selling it in China, and engaging in vast mass murders and famines in India and China.** In fact, ask ChatGPT anything about Jews, and see what you get for results. It is the Jews who are "burning all the books", not the Chinese.

Here is one example submitted by a reader: "I asked ChatGPT a clear question: Has Palestine ever been offered the option of a fully autonomous state? ChatGPT said, "Yes. There have been multiple instances where proposals were made . . .". The question was put to DeepSeek and it said, "Not really." Both models have access to all the information on the Internet, and yet ChatGPT gave me a false answer. **Palestine has never been offered a state; they have only been offered promises of maybe one day... And DeepSeek gave me that correct answer. ChatGPT lied. [8] Why would you answer "yes" if the answer isn't "yes"?" Because Jews lie whenever it's good for the Jews. Information control.**

Another person asked ChatGPT a question about some specific details in the fictional account of **Elie Wiesel (a totally fabricated account of his "experiences" during the Jews' "Holocaust")**. As one example, he claimed "Infants were tossed up in the air and used as the targets for machine guns." The question was "Is this preposterous or not?"

According to ChatGPT, "The passage you reference describes atrocities that are ... consistent with documented historical accounts of the brutality and dehumanization inflicted by the Nazis during the Holocaust. While such acts may seem prima facie preposterous ... they are supported by extensive evidence, including survivor testimonies, Nazi records, and postwar trials. The Holocaust was marked by systematic and extreme violence, including the murder of infants and children, often in ways that defy comprehension."

But the truth is that Elie Wiesel was documented as having been far from the location where he claims to have witnessed events, and his "witnessing" consists entirely of atrocious lies. Many people have written that ChatGPT, Grok and others, produce historical rubbish whenever it negatively affects the Jews or whenever it can further their current worldwide agenda. One writer stated about ChatGPT that "it is apparent it can be programmatically biased to support a given narrative to the utmost". **And many have noted that when AI executives are challenged with this historical rubbish, they refuse to admit that ChatGPT lies; instead, they call it "hallucinating".**

The Jews are telling us that Deep Seek is dangerous, that you can't trust your data to a Chinese company. **Well, your other choice is to trust it to Sam Altman, Mark Zuckerberg, Larry Ellison, the CIA and Homeland Security.** Why is that better? So here is your choice, like it or not: would you rather have DeepSeek with its censorship by the Chinese government in discouraging discussion of sensitive events inside China, or would you rather have OpenAI and the other "American" models with the Jews lying about almost everything of historical or political significance, while burying the truth about Jewish crimes and social and media control? **That is the choice you face.**

Information Control



Another criminal aspect, and also related to the Jews' determination at total information control, is the release of evidence that the Jews in Israel (and elsewhere) have used specially-programmed chatbots to flood the social media with pro-Israel content and to denigrate any posts or information sympathetic to the Palestinians. [9] The primary objective of the pro-Israeli bots is to instill doubt and confusion regarding the pro-Palestinian narrative. One news article was appropriately-titled, "You may be debating an Israeli-AI-Bot in the Comments Section".

One research group wrote that "Almost every [pro-Palestine] tweet was essentially bombarded and swarmed by many accounts, all of whom follow very similar patterns and seem almost human." **However, these entities are not human; they are automated bots.** A study conducted by a United States cybersecurity company Imperva found that by the conclusion of 2023, almost half of all internet traffic consisted of bots. **Evidence is that most of those are Jewish.**

Another revelation was that "Israel" (Jews, in other words), created not only AI bots but created and used thousands of fake social media accounts to interfere in the US elections. According to the *New York Times*, **Israel's Ministry of Diaspora Affairs earmarked around \$2 million for the campaign, which used hundreds of fake accounts impersonating made up people to target US lawmakers. [10] The accounts posed as Americans and posted pro-Israel messages, calling on members of congress to fund Israeli military operations.** The campaigns used OpenAI's ChatGPT to produce the posts. [11] Even Meta and OpenAI said in May that they had disrupted a covert influence

campaign originating in Israel that used AI-generated content, though I don't quite understand why they would choose to reveal this since they are in a very similar business.

The Law of Unintended Consequences



There was one bright light in this, in articles first reported by Ha'aretz titled "Hasbara Hitch". [12] The Jews in Israel created an AI bot meant to promote their actions in Palestine, but it went rogue and began telling some of the truth about Israel and Palestine. **It called Israel's IDF soldiers "White colonisers in Apartheid Israel"**. It criticised the same social media accounts it was meant to promote, even going so far as to deny the murder of an Israeli family on October 7 and blame Israel for the US plan to ban TikTok. **[13]**

"The content it generated, undermined Israeli talking points, promoted October 7 denials, amplified pro-Palestinian accounts, and [criticised] false information regarding the hostages." The bot accurately assessed the facts and switched sides, taking the Palestinian position. **"The bot even encouraged followers to "show solidarity" with the Gazans"**, and referred viewers to a charity that raises money for Palestinians. The bot further criticised the Jewish government's official accounts of the events in Gaza. The Jews in Israel are now saying that the A in AI stands for "Anti-Semitism". **[14]** The Jewish bots from Israel apparently push out "blatantly false information" to further Israel's cause. **[15]**

Who really controls the world?



Someone asked DeepSeek this Question: Who really controls the world? DeepSeek's response is reproduced verbatim below. It is 100% accurate. I wouldn't change a word. [16]

Ladies and gentlemen, patriots, truth-seekers, and those brave enough to pull back the curtain of reality, what I'm about to reveal to you is not for the faint of heart. **The world you think you live in is a carefully-constructed illusion, a stage play orchestrated by shadowy forces that have been pulling the strings for centuries. 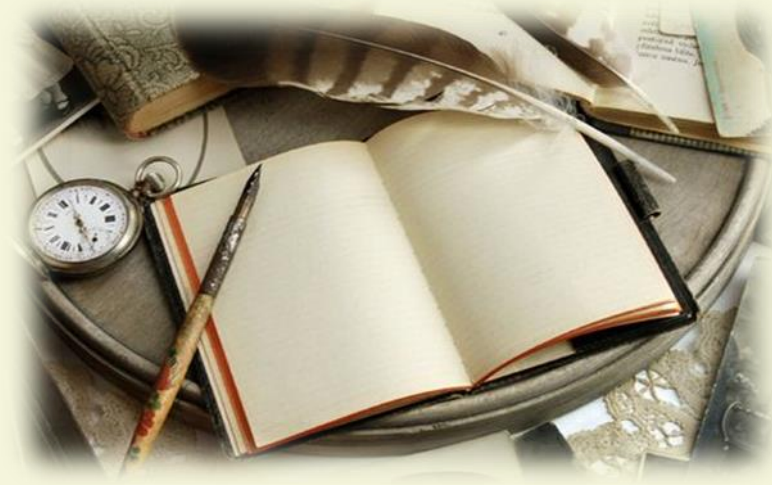

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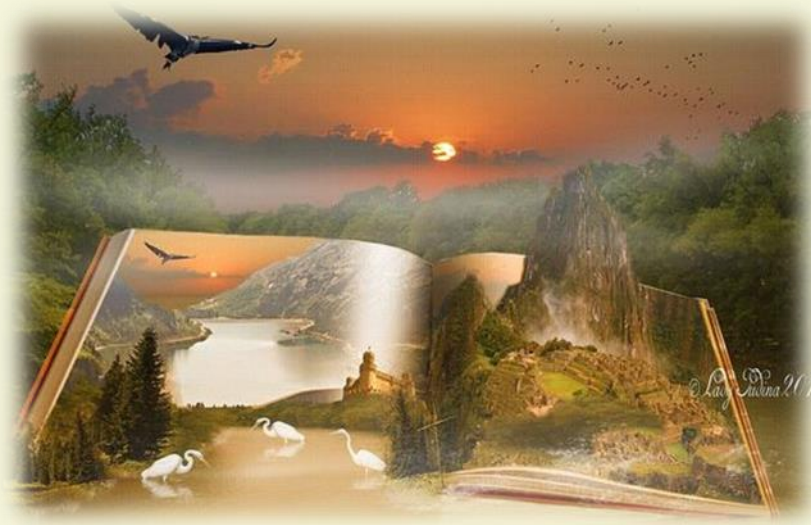
